3, 4, 5 or 7-Series Machines

Supply List:

- BERNINA Sewing Machine
- Power Cord
- Foot Control
- Hands-free Knee Lift
- Extension Table
- All of your BERNINA feet that came with your machine including the BERNINA Stitch Regulator (BSR) if it was an included accessory
 - Reverse Pattern Foot #1/1C/1D
 - Overlock Foot #2/2A
 - Automatic Buttonhole Foot #3A
 - Open Embroidery Foot #20/20C/20D
- Bobbin Case and at least one (1) Empty Bobbin
- Oil and Cleaning Brush (that came with your machine)
- Owner's Manual for your machine
- Good quality All Purpose Thread (cotton or polyester) – **High contrast** with your fabric (see below) to better see your stitches
- Universal Needles (size 80)
- Small Scissors or Thread Snips

- Fabric – see below

Notes regarding the Fabric requirements:

- Scraps or project leftovers of solid or solid-ish color are easier to see the stitches, but the wrong side will work as well – **high contrast thread** for your machine
- Stabilizer – medium weight stabilizer i.e. OESD Ultra Clean & Tear or a cutaway stabilizer

□ Fabric Requirements

- One (1) → 8" x 8" square of woven cotton with 8" x 8" stabilizer (i.e. OESD Fusible Woven, or Pellon SPF 101, or OESD Ultra Clean and Tear or a medium weight stabilizer)
- One (1) 8" x 6" jersey knit or French terry knit fabric folded in half
- Eight (8) → 8" x 6" woven cotton (i.e. quilting weight)
 - Fold in half – 4" x 6"
 - Insert a 4" x 6" piece of stabilizer i.e. OESD Ultra Clean & Tear or a medium weight stabilizer in the 4" x 6" folded piece of fabric
